Graduate Student Research Awards

The Global Health Institute Graduate Student Research Award program supports UW-Madison graduate students pursuing a Ph.D. in any relevant discipline who are exploring potential Ph.D. topics that will enhance global health activities on the UW-Madison campus and beyond. GHI will award several grants in amounts of up to \$5,000 for a duration of one year.

Strong preference will be given to Ph.D. students in their pre-dissertator years.

Proposal Requirements

The proposals should clearly address:

- How the project will advance the [vision and mission of GHI](http://ghi.wisc.edu/about/#Mission&Vision) (ghi.wisc.edu/about/#Mission&Vision) and your doctoral research
- Why GHI funding is essential for the research
- Why other sources of funding are not available
- Budgets must be reviewed for compliance with UW and divisional travel and financial policies by the appropriate grants administrator and/or financial supervisor in the applicant's department or division prior to submitting the final application. It is the responsibility of the PI to know and comply with UW and their own divisional policies and procedures.

The application deadline for all proposals is 5:00 p.m. Monday, February 13, 2017.

Application

The following application components must be on single-spaced, numbered pages (11 point font or larger, 1 inch margins) assembled into a single PDF file:

- GHI Title Page**, including abstract (Use GHI template found online at <http://ghi.wisc.edu/research-awards/graduate-student-research-awards/>)
- Project description** (up to 4 pages), including the following sections:
 1. Introduction, including how your project fits the vision and mission of GHI
 2. Aims/Hypotheses
 3. Methods
 4. Relevance to Global Health
- Detailed budget (including justification)**. Detailed budget in tabular format giving break-downs of expenditures, as appropriate. Include Item-by-item justification of the budget, why GHI funding is essential for this project, and why alternative sources of funding are not appropriate or available. Salaries, tuition and stipends cannot be supported with these funds. Award is in the form of 101 funds. Budget must be reviewed for compliance with UW System and divisional travel and financial policies by the appropriate grants administrator and/or financial supervisor in the applicant's department or division prior to submitting the final application. The name of the person reviewing the budget must be listed on the GHI Application Title Page in Box 10.
- Bio-sketch**. A copy of the applicant's biosketch completed using the NIH Biographical Sketch Format Page: <http://grants.nih.gov/grants/funding/phs398/phs398.html>
- References**. Must include a letter of support from the applicant's Ph.D. advisor.

The following considerations apply to GHI Awards:

Awards will be announced in April 2017 and funds will be available soon after awardees are notified. As the award is in the form of 101 funds, if the award funds are not completely spent by the close of fiscal year 2017 (ending June 30, 2017), it is the responsibility of the awardee to work with your home unit to carryover the funds into the next fiscal year. Please consult with your unit's budget personnel prior to application if this is critical to your planning.

As a condition of receiving GHI funding, you must agree to:

- Follow all UW travel and financial policies, as well as applicant's divisional policies, which are sometimes more restrictive.
- Participate in the Community of Global Health Scholars on campus by presenting research results at appropriate GHI-sponsored events;
- Acknowledge GHI funding in all resulting publications and presentations (sample text: "This project was funded/partially funded through a Graduate Student Research Award from the University of Wisconsin-Madison Global Health Institute.");
- Provide annual and final accountability reports to the GHI regarding use of funds.



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
