NEUROSURGERY IN THE AMAZON RAINFOREST PROVIDING VOICE, CARE FOR NEWLY-CONTACTED COMMUNITIES

with Erik L. Jennings Simões, M.D., neurosurgeon, health coordinator of the Zo'é people and consultant to the Brazilian Ministry of Health

Dr. Jennings Simões works deep in the Amazon rainforest, where he founded the first public service neurosurgery unit. For 18 years, he has operated on patients with specific diseases contracted in the forest and accidents. He divides his time between a municipal hospital and a small hospital in the middle of the forest, where he cares for the Zo'é people, an indigenous recently-contacted tribe.
