UW-MADISON 6TH IN NATIONAL RESEARCH RANKING





The University of Wisconsin-Madison has moved up two places to sixth out of 920 public and private universities in the United States in university research expenditures, according to the National Science Foundation's annual rankings. For the first time, the university has topped \$1.7 billion in research expenditures, according to the NSF Higher Education Research and Development (HERD), released Nov. 25, 2024. A 13.7% increase in research expenditures helped UW rise two places in the National Science Foundation's annual rankings. Click here to learn more.

- + ICYMI: From NPR: "A little-known virus is getting a lot of attention this year. It's called Oropouche, and it's been making headlines because of a notable increase in diagnoses. So far in 2024 there have been over 10,000 cases, mainly in South America and the Caribbean. The vast majority are in Brazil. By contrast, the total Oropouche count in Brazil recorded between 2015 and 2022 was 261. Of the 21 recorded cases in the United States, all involved an individual who had traveled to Cuba and contracted the virus there." Click here for the full story.
